Concerns about human rights violations in Bangladesh, where nearly 6,230 people of the Hindu minority have been killed.

Respected Sir / Madam,

With all due respect,

I am writing to address the human rights violations occurring in Bangladesh. Since the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government, there have been hundreds of attacks against Hindus, who are the largest minority group in the predominantly Muslim country. The situation in Bangladesh has become increasingly chaotic.

The total number of incidents of human rights violations is 41, and nearly 6,230 people have been killed in the recent unrest in Bangladesh between July 16, 2024, and November 25, 2024.
